**Part B. CV SUMMARY (max. 5000 characters, including spaces)**

Rafael Grande is Professor (Associate) of Sociology at the University of Málaga. He has been Predocctoral Fellow (FPU) for four years and Postdoctoral Researcher for two years at the University of Salamanca. In Addition, he has been visiting researcher at the Office of Population Research at Princeton University (New Jersey, USA), the Autonomous University of Chiapas (Mexico), the Centre for Demographic Studies



(Barcelona, Spain) and the Population Program at University of the Republic (Uruguay) with funding from José Castillejo Mobility Grants 2019 (ref. CAS19/00211).

His main areas of interest are demography, sociology of migration and labour economics. Firstly, he has researched the labour and family integration of the immigrant population, their reproductive behaviour and the remittances linked to transnational families. In this line, he has participated as a researcher in 3 national research projects on the study of international migrations and fertility funded by the Spanish National Research, Development and innovation Plan (RTI2018-098455-A-C22; CSO2013-41828-R; CSO2010-16413) and has been the principal investigator (PI) of the Nation research project of the National R&D Plan of the Ministry of Science: "Labour assimilation and social integration in south-south and south-north migratory flows. The case of Latin America and the Caribbean" (ref. CSO2014-57410-JIN). Secondly, he has researched on ageing, causes of death at advanced ages and the phenomenon of unwanted loneliness and the risk of social isolation in adult-elderly people. He has recently participated in technical contracts and projects at Andalusian level linked to the analysis of these phenomena and the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic (ref. PAIDI2020/P20\_00810). Thirdly, his research has addressed labour market mobility processes and job quality in the context of digitalisation and technological change. Here his participation in the European H2020 project "Quality of Jobs and Innovation Generated Employment Outcomes" (QuInnE) and the collaboration with different European institutions through technical transfer contracts stand out. Fourth, the study of low fertility. Currently, he is main research (IP), together with Alberto del Rey, of the national R&D research project "Analysis of 'lowest-low fertility through life transitions: emancipation, couple formation and labor trajectory" (Ref. PID2021-123875NB-I00).

Despite her youth, he has participated continuously in research projects that have led to the generation of high impact results. His publication record comprises 25 papers or book chapters, most of them in high impact indexed journals, including publications such as *Population Research and Policy Review*, *Structural Change and Economic Dynamics*, *Papeles de Población*, *Gaceta Sanitaria*, *Revista Internacional de Sociología* or *Revista de Investigaciones Sociológicas*. In recent years, publications aimed at disseminating scientific knowledge in the social sciences have also been published, for example in collaboration with the Centro de Estudios Andaluces, the Informe España of the University of Comillas or The Social Observatory of the "La Caixa" Foundation. In total, these contributions have received 187 citations in Google Scholar (h index of 9) and 20 citations in Web of Science (h index of 3). He has presented his work at 57 national and international congresses including constant participation in major demography events such as Asociación de Demografía Histórica (ADEH), European Population Conference (EAPS), International Population Conference (IUSSP) or Population Association of America (PAA).

Rafael Grande is member of the research groups "Labor Market, Migrations, Health" (UIC177 Castilla y León) and "Demography and Social Research in Health" (PAIDI SEJ-654 Andalucía). Since 2010 he's editorial director of journal *Encrucijadas. Revista Crítica de Ciencias Sociales*.
